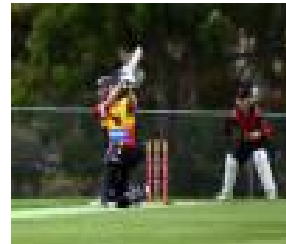
Daniel also won his second successive Club Champions Award by taking our the A Grade best and fairest in a cliff hanger from Coach Jamie Knott
